Scott J. Allen, Ph.D., was elected as a Vice President on the Board of Trustees of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity in August 2008, and was re-elected to another term at the 172nd General Convention of 2011. He is serving a second three-year term on the ten-member board, which guides the activities of more than 7,000 undergraduate members on 122 campuses in the U.S. and Canada, as well as some 123,000 alumni members of the 171-year-old Fraternity.

Scott J. Allen, Ph.D., is an assistant professor of management at John Carroll University where he teaches courses in leadership and management skills. In 2008, Scott was voted the favorite teacher in the Boler School of Business. He also served as a Presidential Fellow at Case Western Reserve University where he taught Leadership in Modern Society. Scott is a graduate of The Art and Practice of Leadership Development, an executive education program of the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.

He is published in the *Encyclopedia of Leadership* and co-authored *A Charge Nurse's Guide: Navigating the Path of Leadership*, a leadership book for health care professionals. Scott is also the co-author of *Emotionally Intelligent Leadership: A Guide for College Students* (Jossey-Bass) and the corresponding suite of resources (Facilitation & Activity Guide, Workbook, Inventory and Development Guide).
