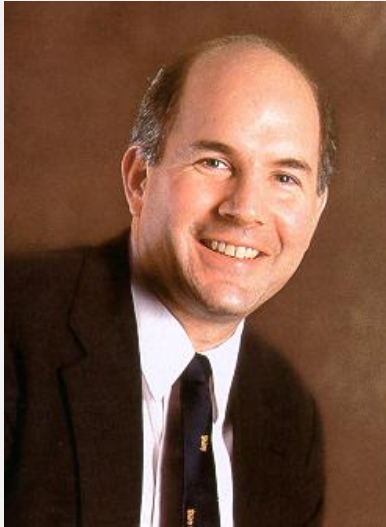

Michael G. (Mike) Feinstein was elected General Treasurer of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity at the Fraternity's 170th General Convention in Scottsdale, Arizona, August 2009. He previously served as a Board member and Chairman of the Beta Theta Pi Foundation since 2003. As a member of Beta Theta Pi's ten-member board, he helps guide the activities of more than 7,000 undergraduate members on 122 campuses in the U.S. and Canada, as well some 123,000 alumni members of the 171-year-old Fraternity.
